JAKE ARMERDING

Friday, January 6 - \$10M, \$12NM

Jake Armerding began violin lessons at four and joined the accomplished bluegrass band, Northern Lights, when he was just 13 years old. In gigs at the Beal House it was clear that he did not in the least owe his spot in the band to the fact that his father, Taylor Armerding, was the band's frontman on mandolin and high lonesome vocals. He was obviously a talented musician with exceptional stage presence early on. Jake released his own album of original, folk-and-bluegrass material while still a teenager. That album, *Caged Bird* was a success, Armerding selling 2500 copies on his own. It captured the Best New Artist award at WUMB 91.9fm Boston. The next three years saw dozens of performances around New England, collaborations on stage with such artists as David Wilcox, Peter Rowan and Charlie Peacock. Then, Jake recorded his first nationally released album, *Jake Armerding*. Jake now divides his time between touring, writing songs and jamming with buddies around town. He currently performs on fiddle, mandolin, guitar and vocals, sometimes with his dad on mandolin and Corey DiMario on upright bass.

ANNUAL ALL OPEN MIKE NIGHT

Friday, January 20 - \$5M & Performers, \$6NM

This is our annual night when you are the star! Sing, play instrumentals, recite poetry, tell a short story. There will be fourteen 8 minute Open Mike slots, enough time to do two songs. Plus this year, featured performer Lynn Feingold will present a four song set. All performance types welcome, not just folk. The best open mike is full of variety, so come on down and share your special performance with our warm audience. Tonight is our Sampler Music CD Recording Party, too. We'll be recording the evening, and your performance might be selected to be on the CD. This year we're hoping to include covers as well as originals and public domain material on the CD (the performer would be responsible for the licensing charge).

MAD AGNES

Friday, February 3 - \$13 Members, \$15 Non-members

Mad Agnes' music – created by Margo Hennebach, Adrienne Jones, and Mark Saunders – delights and incites. They do it with rich, three-part harmonies, balanced musicianship, and clever songwriting that is at once familiar and unique. The Connecticut-based trio's musical bond stretches across three bands, two solo careers, one and a half decades and a large repertoire encompassing ten releases. In concert they move from bold, lushly arranged songs to pared down, spare and simple ones, showcasing their ample musical range. Full instrumentation (acoustic, electric, slide and bass guitars, piano and synth) and arrangements support harmonies that range from angelic to rambunctious. Hennebach's and Jones' award-winning songwriting is sometimes whimsical, often poignant, and powerful. The group has a recently released DVD entitled **Who's Mad Agnes?** Reviewing their latest CD, **Magic Hour**, Rich Warren of SING OUT! Magazine wrote, "*This recording is magic...glorious harmonies, highly original arrangements and memorable songs...perfect production.*" and Céline Keating of Acoustic Guitar called it "*a flawless CD with a unique sound.*"

COFFEEHOUSE – February 17 - \$5M, \$6NM

Tesseract is a Southcoast based trio consisting of Joan Akin, Joanne Doherty, and Mary Beth Soares. Known for their rich vocal harmonies, they cover a wide range of music that includes traditional, contemporary, nostalgic, and even an original or two. Whether singing a cappella or accompanied by guitar, Tesseract is sure to delight.

Joanne Doherty will open. Joanne is a unique singer with a smooth alto voice that never fails to turn heads. She delicately accompanies herself on guitar. Joanne has credits on a number of albums, and currently sings with the trio Tesseract and as a duo with Charlie Cover. This is your chance to see Joanne performing her compelling and moving repertoire of songs.
