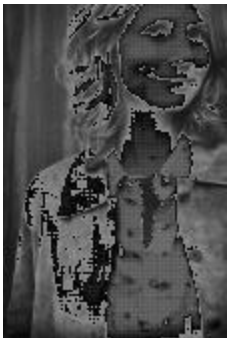

VALERIE & WALTER CROCKETT and THE OXYMORONS - Friday, May 5 - \$10M, \$12NM

In a time of slickly produced publicity and web sites about musicians, you can actually get a good idea about what Valerie and Walter Crocket are like by visiting their "low-tech, frame-free, script-free, no-frills, hand-carved website." You can learn there that they live in Worcester, play at coffeehouses and concerts with their "fabulous band, the Oxymorons," (beware that the band will "drive you to a frenzy of catatonia"-which we surmise is a good thing), and that a number of people with very good taste in music have said some very nice things about them. For example, Scott Alarik wrote in the Boston Globe that "Walter and Valerie Crocket delighted the Concord crowd with their confident professionalism, smartly wrapped harmonies, and sweet, rolling melodicism." They were voter *Best Musicians* by readers of *Worcester Magazine*, and praise for their four recordings describe them as featuring "crystal-clear sound, tight instrumental work and sharp songs...can play awesome licks, but perform cohesively and always in a way that complements the song...Valerie has a truly lovely voice, sort of breathy and pretty at the same time...Walter's bluegrass/blues combo makes one feel he has been there." And they're funny.

COFFEEHOUSE - Friday, May 19 - \$5M, \$6NM

Northampton based singing and songwriting duo *Polly and Anand* cast any stage with the intimacy of a livingroom concert. Their songs and melodies are cut from honest, homespun fabric with an ear for stories, harmonies, and soul. Equally at home in a mountain ballad, an environmental folk anthem or an Etta James-esque blues rocker, Polly's voice maintains a purity and conviction that is the very definition of originality. Anand's wide vocal range, compelling lead vocals, ear for vocal and instrumental harmony, and gutsy and emotive guitar style create a rich musical landscape. And together they deliver sublime harmonies.

Mel Green (1960's South African Columbia recording artist) has evolved from interpreter of the traditional "folk music songbook" to a creator of original songs with singable choruses and interesting stories that speak to mature audiences of today. Today, Mel performs his original songs which are evocative and draw his audience into stories gleaned from his life, his times and his experiences. He performs solo or with his band of 17 years, the Maple Street Project, and is known to sing harmony with anyone at the drop of a hat! Over the years Mel has appeared at folk clubs and festivals in South Africa, London, Greenwich Village and Sydney.

Jim Henry is a multi-talented musician with a wide reputation for versatility. He can play most things stringed, sing lead or harmony, write great songs, produce, engineer and arrange. Together Tracy Grammer and Jim Henry carry not just the legacy of Dave Carter's music, but also an expanding repertoire of music that audiences connect with immediately and affectionately.
