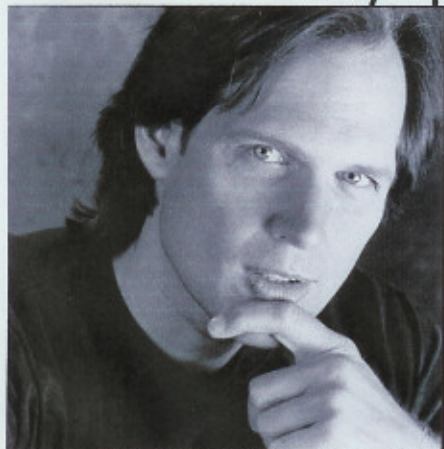

THREE OF CUPS - Friday, March 2 - \$8M, \$10NM

Three of Cups is a vivacious female vocal group that keeps alive a legacy of three hundred years of rousing revelry and song. They present a rich, entrancing blend of voice, fiddle, and guitar. Three of Cups is equally at ease in performing cheering English bawdry, bittersweet Irish ballads, or uplifting American gospel. Their audience rapport is warm, witty and scintillating. From the pulpit to the pub, Three of Cups will rouse a crowd and raise spirits through song. Deborah Claar and Ann-Marie Messbauer have been singing together since 1987. They bring their camaraderie, harmonious voices and love of storytelling to New England coffeehouses, lecture halls and concert stages. In the view of Tony Barrand, the great traditional folk singer, Three of Cups is "a very powerful music unit, able to achieve that rare event of telling a story in song while harmonies support and enhance rather than detract from the narrative." Perhaps a clue to the music of this group is that the Three of Cups is also a tarot card that carries the meanings of joyful social contact, agreement, general harmony and frivolity.

COFFEEHOUSE, Friday March 16 - \$5 M, \$6 NM

Steeped in American "roots" music, **Pat Wictor** is a contemporary songwriter and master interpreter drawing on rural country, gospel, and blues. Wielding a mean lap slide guitar, Pat was voted "most wanted" in the emerging artist showcase at last summer's Falcon Ridge Folk Festival. He draws on symbolic and spiritual imagery for his fifth CD, "Heaven Is So High", possibly his most heartfelt release to date. And if that's not enough, one top reviewer remarked that "follicle by follicle, he has the best hair in folk music today."

Opening for Pat is Plymouth guitarist and songwriter **Frank Albani**, whose guideposts are his faith in people and love for the land. An organic farmer and President of the Northeast Organic Farming Association of Massachusetts, Frank reminds us that only we can create the world we want to live in. For many years he has worked at the Soule Homestead Education Center in Middleboro, teaching people about the web of life and helping kids to understand we are all in this together. Frank urges you to get involved in your community because "thinks globally, act locally" remains as meaningful as ever.

Following Pat and Frank, we open up our stage to you, so please sign up for our **Open Mic** at 7:30. All styles of music and spoken word are welcome. Treat yourself to our attentive audience.

GREG GREENWAY – Friday, April 6 - \$13 M, \$15 NM

Greg Greenway is a rare combination of instrumental expert, soulful and moving singer, powerful poet and sparkling entertainer. He is one of those difficult-to-categorize performers who have found a home in the modern acoustic genre. Musically, he draws inspiration

from all over the map--gospel, rock, blues, Jazz, and world music. But his center is in the singer/songwriter tradition that traces its roots all the way back to the social awareness of Woody Guthrie. His core appeal is that it all comes through the singular lens of Greenway's humanity and his easy affinity for the audience. He has one of the strongest and finest voices in folk music. The Boston Globe wrote, "Confessional one moment, rambunctiously disarming the next, few modern folk singers can own a coffeehouse stage as completely as Greenway." Among Greenway's performance highlights are a show at Carnegie Hall in the New York Singer/Songwriter Festival which was rebroadcast on NPR's World Cafe, an appearance on nationally syndicated Mountain Stage, and a show at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame honoring Phil Ochs.

COFFEEHOUSE, Friday April 20 - \$5M, \$6NM

Tall Richard is a local musician hailing from Manomet. A superb blues harp player, Tall Richard really knows how to rock a house. With a faithful legion of fans, this bluesman, along with the great Darren King on guitar, makes another appearance at the SSFMC! Tall says "we will rock, swing, boogie and rhumba the night away and we encourage all lovers of American blues music not to miss this show!" If it's a party you're looking for, Tall Richard will not disappoint - arrive early for the best seats.

Karen Woodhall embraces all the influences of contemporary folk and acoustic music: from folk, pop standards, blues-tinged torch to jazz. Sometimes described as "big-mama blues with a little-girl voice", Karen brings a refreshing and joyful approach to her music, with a natural and unassuming style that's easy and accessible. **The Open Mike** follows these acts.
